You, and each of you, will hereby take notice that pursuant to an order entered by the Board of County Commissioners dated August 4, 1941, and

LEGAL NOTICES

under and by virtue of the Consolidated Statutes, Section 5030(A-1), the United States Navy will remove all of the graves in the following graveyards for the reason that said graves are in the way of construction, or will be damaged by maneuvering of troops:

(a) Gurganus Graveyard, in Area B, (b) Patten Graveyard, in Area B, (c) Stiles Graveyard, in Area C, (d) Young Graveyard, in Area C, (e) Sanders Graveyard, in Area C, (f) Simmons Graveyard, in Area C, (g) Hemby-Ward Graveyard, in Area C, (h) McAlister Graveyard, in Area D, (i) Farnell Graveyard, in Area D, (j) Maready Graveyard, in Area D, (k) Gornto Graveyard, in Area D.

It is the intention of the Navy to remove the white bodies in these graveyards to a new site on U. S. Highway No. 24, just East of the corporate limits of the Town of Jacksonville and adjacent to the present white city cemetery. The colored bodies will be moved to a new site on U. S. Highway No. 17, just North of the Town of Verona.

Any party desiring to raise objections to the order as entered by the County Board of Commissioners of Onslow County is hereby notified to file said objections in writing with said Board within thirty (30) days from the date of this notice.
